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THE DEVELOPMENT OF TOURISM INDUSTRIES AFTER COVID-19 PANDEMIC IN NUSA DUA, BALI

Abstract

This study aimed to analyze the development of tourism industries after Covid-19 pandemic in Nusa Dua, by conducted the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) analyses. The research methodology used includes literature review, observation, and interviews with community leaders, tourism industries figures, government on March 2023. The data analysis techniques mentioned-data reduction, data display, and conclusion drawing / verification, are commonly associated with the qualitative research method.

After the Covid-19 pandemic, tourism industries in Nusa Dua is expected to prioritize sustainable tourism development, focusing on promoting eco-tourism, responsible tourism practices, and ensuring equitable distribution of benefits to local communities. The tourism industry in Nusa Dua has adapted to the new normal and is implementing government protocols for tourism activities.

SWOT analysis reveals that the tourism industry has strengths in natural resources, established infrastructure, diversified products, and advanced digital technology. The weaknesses such as over-reliance on tourism, negative impact on environment and culture, and unequal distribution of benefits exist. The industry has opportunities in increasing tourist numbers, government support, ecotourism and sustainable tourism development, and cultural tourism. However, competition from other destinations, natural disasters, lack of government regulation, and the COVID-19 pandemic pose threats.

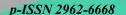

This has led to the conducting of research on the development of the tourism industry in Nusa Dua in the new normal era

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the world, not just on tourism, but also on education, health, the economy, and society as a whole. As a result, many industries have had to implement stricter health protocols, and old patterns can no longer be applied. The tourism industry in particular has been greatly affected, and it has become crucial to implement fast and accurate information and communication technology to stay competitive. This article focuses on the development of the tourism industry in Nusa Dua, Bali after the Covid-19 pandemic, and explores the strengths, weaknesses, obstacles, and challenges that have emerged in the "new normal" era. While many studies have already been conducted on this topic, further research is needed to anticipate and address the changing dynamics within the community, as well as to address any negative issues that may arise. The aim of this study is to gain a better understanding of Nusa Dua's strengths and weaknesses, as well as the obstacles and challenges it faces, in order to determine appropriate steps for the future.

Literature Review

1. Tourism Industries Development Definition

2. Formerly research in Nusa Dua, Bali

Tourism Development has some impact on community livelihood in Nusa Dua Bali (Putra & Wardana, 2018). The research examines the impact of tourism development on the livelihood of the community in Nusa Dua, Bali. The study uses a mixed-method approach, combining qualitative and quantitative methods, to collect data from 200 households in the area. The research findings show that tourism development has had a significant positive impact on the economic and social aspects of the community's livelihood. The tourism industry has created job opportunities, increased household income, and improved access to education and healthcare. However, the study also highlights some negative impacts, such as environmental degradation and cultural changes. The researchers suggest that sustainable tourism development policies should be implemented to minimize the negative impacts and maximize the positive impacts on the community's livelihood.

Tourism development has impact on economy and environment in Nusa Dua Bali (Ariyanti & Martini, 2020). The study found that tourism development has a positive impact on the local economy, particularly in terms of generating income and employment opportunities. However, the rapid growth of tourism in the area has also caused negative impacts on the environment, such as pollution and resource depletion. The researchers suggest that sustainable tourism practices should be implemented to minimize the negative impact on the environment and to ensure the long-term sustainability of the tourism industry in Nusa Dua.

The impact of tourism development on local culture in Nusa Dua Bali includes (Ardila & Amalia, 2019). The research revealed that the rapid growth of tourism in the area has led to some negative impacts on the local culture. One of the significant impacts is the commodification of culture, where the traditional culture of Bali is being commercialized and turned into a product for tourists. This has resulted in the loss of the authenticity and integrity of the Balinese culture.

Furthermore, the research findings also revealed that the growth of tourism in Nusa Dua has caused changes in the local social and cultural values. The influx of tourists with different beliefs and cultural backgrounds has influenced the local community's values and norms, leading to the erosion of traditional values. The study also highlighted that the tourism industry's dominance has resulted in the























marginalization of the local community, leading to socio-cultural conflicts. The study concludes that while tourism development in Nusa Dua has contributed to the local economy's growth, it has also brought negative impacts on the local culture, and there is a need for sustainable tourism development that preserves the Balinese culture and benefits the local community (Ardila & Amalia, 2019).

The impact of tourism development on local community empowerment in Nusa Dua Bali (Wijaya & Setiawan, 2018). The research found that tourism development has the potential to empower the community through the creation of employment opportunities and the enhancement of local skills and knowledge. They also note that tourism development can provide a platform for the community to participate in decision-making processes and to showcase their culture and traditions. There are challenges to community empowerment in the context of tourism development, such as unequal distribution of benefits and the dominance of external stakeholders in decision-making. Effective community empowerment requires a collaborative and participatory approach that involves the active participation of the community in the planning and management of tourism development.

The impact of tourism development on land use changes in Nusa Dua Bali (Mertayasa dkk, 2019). The findings revealed that the rapid expansion of the tourism industry in the area has led to significant changes in land use, such as the conversion of agricultural land and forests into tourist facilities and infrastructure. This has resulted in a decline in the availability of land for agriculture and natural resource management, leading to environmental degradation and reduced access to resources for local communities. The study highlights the need for sustainable land use planning and management to balance the development of tourism with the preservation of natural resources and the well-being of local communities.

The development of ecotourism in Nusa Dua Bali: Challenges and opportunities (Sukma & Mudana, 2020). The research discussed the need for sustainable tourism practices that balance economic development with environmental conservation, and they identify several key challenges to ecotourism development, such as inadequate infrastructure, lack of government support, and low community involvement. Despite these challenges, the authors argue that ecotourism has the potential to promote sustainable development and provide economic benefits to local communities. The authors conclude that sustainable tourism development in Nusa Dua Bali requires a collaborative effort between the government, tourism industry, and











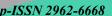


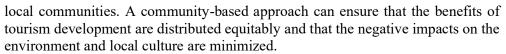

- Increasing demand for sustainable and responsible tourism, providing an opportunity for Nusa Dua to position itself as a leader in this area











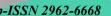












- Growing interest in cultural tourism, which can provide an opportunity for the preservation and promotion of local culture
